Thoughts From Vicar Travis

Love That Comes to Us

February often brings with it reminders of love—cards, candy, and gestures meant to say, you matter to me. While those can be sweet and meaningful, the love at the heart of our faith runs deeper and lasts longer than any season or sentiment.

Scripture reminds us that love does not begin with us. As John writes, “We love because God first loved us” (1 John 4:19). This is good news. God’s love is not something we earn by being faithful enough, kind enough, or strong enough. It comes to us freely, spoken over us in baptism, repeated in forgiveness, and made visible at the table. Again and again, God chooses us.

That kind of love changes how we see one another. In a world that often divides, measures, and excludes, Christ’s love draws us together. It teaches us patience when we are frustrated, compassion when we are tired, and hope when we are uncertain. Love, in this sense, is not just a feeling, it is a way of life shaped by grace.

As we move through these winter weeks, my prayer is that we remain rooted in this truth: God’s love is steady, present, and active among us. May we receive it with gratitude and share it freely—with our neighbors, our communities, and one another—trusting that God is always at work, even in the quiet seasons.

Most are potluck meals where each couple or person contributes a dish.


There should also be some time for a devotion. (e.g. Sharing Stories, playing games, prayer, bible reading, etc.)

New Faces On The Synod Staff Rev. Cara Knutson has accepted the position of Assistant to the Bishop for Mobility, Call Process, and Congregational Care within the Synod Staff. She has been serving full-time at Emanuel Lutheran Church in Council Bluffs since December 2019 and previously worked as a chaplain at the Methodist Retirement Community in Storm Lake, IA. Rev. Cara has served on the synod council, the synod candidacy committee, and is currently the vice president of the Southwest Iowa National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) board. She will serve the synod part-time while continuing her role at Emanuel Lutheran.



Dominique Fritz-Rapsch is the new part-time Synod Bookkeeper. He will split his time between remote work and in-person duties at the Synod Office. When he is not involved in ministry with the Synod, he works as an accountant at Berkshire Hathaway, bringing a decade of accounting experience. He is also the husband of Rev. Jamie Fritz-Rapsch, who serves at St. Mark in Sioux City.

A New Chapter in Faith's Ministry

On June 1, 2025, Bethel Lutheran Church in Kiron and Faith Lutheran Church in Odebolt entered into an Agreement for TEEM Ministry with Travis Brincks to serve our congregations until completing seminary.

This program is an alternative path to ordination, integrating seminary education, local mentoring, and practical experience to prepare leaders for specific ministry contexts such as rural ministry.

Vicar Travis actively participated in church leadership at St. John Lutheran in Carroll and serves on the synod council of the Western Iowa Synod. His foundation in Lutheran theology was received through the synod's Lay School of Ministry, and he is currently pursuing his seminary studies through the TEEM program while serving our congregations.
