New Light for a New Year

January always arrives quietly. After the hustle and bustle of the holiday season, we find ourselves standing at the doorway of a new year—often tired, reflective, and hopeful all at once. The church, in her wisdom, does not rush us forward. Instead, she invites us into the season of **Epiphany**, a season of light.

Epiphany reminds us that God is still revealing God's self in the ordinary places of our lives. The Magi follows a star, not knowing exactly where it will lead. They trust that the light is enough for the next step. In many ways, that is how we begin a new year as people of faith—not with all the answers, but with trust in the One who goes before us.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

In 2025 all of the Quilts and Kits that have been assembled to help Lutheran World Relief have gone to Angola, Djibouti, Georgia, Honduras, Jordan, Liberia, Madagascar, Mali, Romania, Serbia, Sierra Leone, Tanzania, Ukraine, United States East, United States Central, United States West, and Zimbabwe. Sending 315,818 Quilts, 179,200 School Kits, 231,811 Personal Care Kits, 66,984 Baby Care Kits, and 9,368 Fabric Kits.

WHY JESUS: The Season of Epiphany

- **Timing:** The Christmas season ends on January 6, 2026 (Epiphany Day). The "Time after Epiphany" then runs from January 7 until the start of Lent on February 18.

- **Focus:** While Christmas focuses on the Incarnation (God becoming flesh), the Epiphany season shifts to how God reveals himself in that same flesh of Christ. The name "Epiphany" comes from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, meaning a manifestation or a king's visit.

- **Key Events:** The lectionary readings during this season recount key events in Jesus' public ministry that reveal his divine nature and mission to the Gentiles (all nations). Specific services in January 2026 include:

- **The Name of Jesus (Jan 1):** A commemoration of Jesus' given name as a sign of salvation.

- **Epiphany of Our Lord (Jan 6):** Commemorates the visit of the Magi, representing the manifestation of Christ to the wider world (Gentiles).

- **The Baptism of Jesus (Jan 11):** This event is described as a clear demonstration, with a voice from heaven, that Jesus is not only a man but also the Son of God and the Savior.

- **Subsequent Sundays:** Readings continue to explore Jesus' public ministry and teachings, inviting the church to grow in the knowledge and understanding of Christ.
